

Becket Launches Official Brand and Announces Newest Hub Location

St. John's, NL (September 11, 2025) – Today marks the official launch of Becket, Newfoundland and Labrador's network of Integrated Youth Services (IYS) hubs. A province-wide digital campaign is set to begin next week. The launch introduces Becket as a youth-first, province-wide initiative designed to make it easier for young people to access the care and support they need — all in one place.

Built for youth aged 12–29, Becket hubs will provide wraparound services including mental health care, health and wellness supports, housing resources, employment and education programs, and opportunities for peer connection. Integrated Youth Services is a national best practice model, with hubs operational or in development in every province and territory.

Becket Branding

The Becket brand was developed through a collaborative process involving youth, community partners, and interest holders across Newfoundland and Labrador. Colours were drawn from photographs of Newfoundland landscapes captured by youth, grounding the brand in both place and lived experience. A public survey, which received 180 responses, invited youth and community members to vote on the final name. The result is an identity that is youth-driven and community-rooted, reflecting the values and hopes of the people it was built to serve.

First Becket Hubs Announced

As part of today's launch, Becket announced the first official hubs:

- *NEW* Becket Corner Brook Operated by Vine Place Community Centre (anticipated opening: 2026)
- Becket St. John's Operated by Choices for Youth (operational since 2004)

Each hub will be operated by an established community organization acting as the local "lead agency," following Becket's shared standards of care while tailoring services to meet local needs.

A Collaborative Model, Designed with Youth in Mind

Becket was created in response to an urgent need: to ensure youth in Newfoundland and Labrador can access the right support, at the right time. Following years of consultation and engagement with youth, service providers, and community leaders across the province, the Becket model was developed with input from steering committees in every region.

The development of Becket Integrated Youth Services in Newfoundland and Labrador has been led, in partnership, by Choices for Youth and Newfoundland and Labrador (NL) Health Services and supported by a coalition of national and provincial funders. While the team is excited to announce Corner Brook as the second IYS hub for the province, the vision for Becket is nine connected hub sites across Newfoundland and Labrador.
